Rules and Regulations

The rules and regulation are prescribed by the Board of Directors of the Johnson County Fair Association. The rules and regulations are for application in connection with the operation of all departments of the Fair.

All exhibits are subject to the following rules:

General Rules

1. The Board of Directors shall have charge and control of the Fair Grounds during the Fair and shall be the supreme authority on the conduct of the Fair and reserves the right to amend and add to these rules as they in their option may deem advisable. The chairmen of the various departments will be in full

control of the departments over which they are appointed and commissioned. They will be responsible for the special rules of their respective departments. Any person who violates any of the rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums.

2. Every animal and article on the grounds shall be under the general control of the organization during the Fair and while every precaution will be taken for safe-keeping, neither the Association, nor its officers or chairmen, shall be responsible in case of loss, damage or accident that may occur. Due diligence will also be used by the officers of the Association to safeguard and prevent injuries to persons, but the Association will not be responsible in case accidents do occur.
3. Competition is open to all in Open Class, regardless of residence.
4. No entries will be accepted for competition unless a class is shown in this catalog. Entries may be accepted for display only, if space is available, but no premiums will be offered.
5. Admission to all exhibits will be free to the public.
6. Entry. Exhibitors should advise the chairman of the department of their intentions to exhibit livestock so the space may be provided. Forms for this purpose are in the back of this book or online at www.jocokansasfair.com Stalls or pens must be cleaned by the owners of the livestock.
7. Entries must be the property of the exhibitor and entered in his or her name. Exhibits must be entered at the designated time to be eligible for ribbons or premium money. Exhibits in 4-H, FFA and Open Class, (except livestock and open class flowers) will be accepted Monday from 6:30 – 9:00 p.m. and Tuesday from 8:00 – 10:00 a.m. See specific departments for check in times of livestock and flowers.
8. All agricultural exhibits must be the products of the current year.
9. Judging in all classes will be by competent, impartial and experienced judges. No person will be permitted to approach the judges while the judging is in progress and an entry system will be used whereby the identity of the exhibitor will not be known until after judging has taken place.
10. Judging of exhibits will proceed as outlined in the Schedule or posted on the Fair grounds.
11. A judge, at his/her discretion, may withhold any or all premiums if an article, or animal, in his/her judgment, is not worthy of award.
12. In classes where there is no competition, the first prize and ribbon will be awarded, if worthy. Only two prize monies may be awarded to an exhibitor in any one class. See rules in each department.
13. Ribbons will be left with the exhibits while they are on display.
14. Trophies and Special Awards will be dependent on securing sponsors.
15. Premiums: 4-H – Purple or Blue - \$1.00, Red - \$.75 and White - \$.50, except for livestock departments. Livestock premiums listed under individual departments. OPEN – Blue - \$3.00, Red \$2.00 and White \$1.00, except for livestock departments. Livestock premiums listed under individual departments.
16. Open Class premiums will be paid Sunday between approximately 9:00 AM (after church service) and 1:00 PM.
17. 4-H premiums will be paid Sunday between the PA announcement and 1:00 PM.
18. Requested corrections to premium checks must be submitted by 1:00 PM on Sunday.

19. If the exhibitor cannot pick up their premium check at the above times they may provide the office with a self addressed, stamped envelope to have their premium check sent to them. Premium checks not mailed or picked up will be forfeited
20. Release time will be Sunday as follows: Livestock/Horses are released and may be removed after 6:00 AM, clean up of stall areas and their immediate area is the responsibility of the exhibitor; all other entries will release after church service. Please respect the church service by limiting the noise and activity. Exhibits remain the property of the exhibitor throughout the fair and must be reclaimed at the above time or arrangements made by the exhibitor to have them picked up. The Fair Association will assume no responsibility for exhibits. Any exhibit removed before release time will bar exhibitor from exhibiting next year.
21. Buildings on the grounds will be open to the public at 10:00 a.m. except Tuesday when they open at 7:30 a.m.(closed during judging) On Saturday they do not open until after the parade. Exhibit buildings will be closed at 10:00 p.m. Gates will be locked one half hour after the carnival closes for the night. South Service gate will be open from 6 a.m. till 12:00 p.m..
22. All fair book changes or corrections shall be given to the fair book committee in writing.

Livestock Rules

1. Stalls and alley ways shall be kept neat and clean at all times. An award for best decorated, well kept stall will be given. No stall is to be used for feed, bedding or personal belongings. They are for livestock only.
2. Bedding must be furnished by exhibitor.
3. All steers and market heifers will be mouthed by the official mouther. Permanent incisor teeth cannot have erupted and all baby teeth must be present in order to show. This guideline is in keeping with state.
4. No exhibitor may alter their animal's natural conformation and structure. Altering the color or structure of the hair or wool coat in any way (except for trimming or blocking) is not allowed. Any animal which when rubbed with a white cloth shows residual evidence of artificial coloring will be dismissed from the show. Coloring to the hocks will be accepted.
5. During the fair any administration or injection of any compound that may cause quantitative or qualitative change in the characteristic of the animal on foot or in carcass is cause for disqualification from the show.
6. Any medication given to any animal on the fair grounds must be administered by a licensed veterinarian, with the approval of the superintendent.
7. No exhibitor of cattle, swine, goats and sheep can show more then 2 market animals (i.e. 2 hogs, 2 sheep, 2 market beef, 2 goats).
8. 4-Her's must be 7 years old by January 1 of the current year to be eligible to exhibit livestock at the county fair.
9. All market 4-H/FFA sheep, steers, market heifers, hogs and goats must be tagged by a County Extension Agent or the Johnson County Fair's designee on our Spring Show date or they may be tagged by any County Extension Agent on or before our Spring Show date. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide proof to the Johnson County Fair Association through the extension office that the animal was tagged properly.
10. Dress Codes will be used for livestock shows. Beef, dairy, sheep, goats and

swine exhibitors are required to wear jeans which must be blue and the official Johnson County Fair Livestock Show T- Shirt.

11. No livestock will be unloaded in the camping area.
12. All trucks, trailers, not used for camping, must be parked in assigned areas. Two parking passes will be given per family for those stalling livestock for the duration of the fair. Parking will be enforced starting noon Wednesday. Passes will be distributed during livestock weigh in on Wednesday morning. Passes will be available in the Fair office starting Wednesday afternoon.
13. Mistreatment of animals will not be tolerated and will be a cause for disqualification as determined by the Livestock Superintendent, Department Head Chairman and Fair Board President.
14. All cattle in the barn, except bucket calves, will be bedded on sand that will be provided. No straw will be allowed. A night tie-out area will be provided. Straw or chips may be used in that area. Cattle may be moved to tie-out area at 6:00 p.m..
15. It is the intent of the Johnson County Fair Board to conduct blood, DNA and/or urine analysis on any animal entered in the Johnson County competition at its discretion. The exhibitor of an animal producing an analysis of diuretic or any unapproved medication will be required to forfeit all prizes and premiums and may be barred from future competition at the fair.
16. The weight of all animals sold at the Livestock Auction will be reduced by 4% to reflect the actual shipping weight.
17. In the event that a veterinary would be needed for an animal, at the owners expense there will be a veterinary on call or the owner may call their own veterinary.
18. Once an animal has reached the scales the animal will be weighed. No re-weighs will be allowed.
19. Two chutes are provided for grooming beef. Other chutes will be permitted only in designated area.
20. All livestock exhibitors whose entries place in a blue ribbon group are encouraged to exhibit at the state fair provided they can meet the other requirements of weight and age. Please check the Kansas State Fair Exhibitor Hand Book.
21. Any 4-H/FFA member that has previously shown in a 4-H/FFA class at a county fair in the current year is only eligible for open class exhibition.
22. NO ELECTRICAL DEVICES WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE SWINE PENS
Only cordless clippers are allowed.
23. Market Swine - Shaved Market Swine will be disqualified. Hair must be at least 5/8 inch or longer.

Livestock Health Requirements

Livestock with Kansas Origin: A local veterinarian will be present to inspect all animals to see that there is no evidence of a contagious or infectious disease. The animals will be inspected before unloading.

Poultry: All Poultry, except waterfowl, must show proof that they are pullorum-typhoid clean at time of entry. The cost the test is the responsibility of the exhibitor. To comply with State Law, testing will be done every year.

Exhibitors must know the answers to the following questions at the time of entry:

Location address of flock

Name and address of the hatchery or dealer where purchased
 Breed, Variety, Strain or Trade Name of exhibit
 Number of males and females in the flock
 Total number of birds in the flock
 Age of Birds

Livestock with out of state origin must meet all health requirements as in-state animals. In addition, any livestock showing at local fairs which originate in other states must meet Kansas import requirements. Trucks hauling these animals must stop at a Kansas Port of Entry. These exhibitors should have two (2) copies of their health certificate, leaving one copy at the Kansas Port of Entry and bringing one copy to the fair.

3. Recommended method of processing must be used.
4. Open kettle processed fruits and vegetables will not be accepted.
5. Pickles and sweet spreads that contain fruit pulp or pulp must be finished by water bath process.
6. Jars must be sealed when entered, paraffin not acceptable.

7. Screw band and flat must be same brand as jar.
8. Judges may or may not open jars to taste entry for quality.

 - a. Tightly sealed and sanitary
 - b. Properly labeled (include method and name of item)
 - c. Canned during the current season
 - d. Complete unit – add screw band loosely (to protect foods when flat has been loosened and for better display)

11. Fruits and tomatoes must be processed in either a water bath or pressure canner.
12. Vegetables and Meats must be processed in a pressure canner.
13. Pickles and relishes must be processed in a water bath.
14. Sweet spreads and jelly must be processed in a water bath.

10. All flowers should be arranged in containers and ready for display when brought. All exhibitors should have the correct names of flowers entered and class number.
11. No prizes will be awarded unless the judge considers the entry worthy.

1. Exhibits will be judged according to “Exhibiting Fruits and Vegetables, Bulletin No.C-405”, available to the public at the County Extension Office.
2. Guidelines are as follows:
 - a. Condition-30%
 - b. Quality-25%
 - c. Uniformity-20%
 - d. Typical of Variety (except largest and novelty classes)-15%
 - e. Size-10%
3. See bulletin for specific information
4. Entry tags are available at the Fair Office the Saturday before the fair.
5. Organic Gardens are those in which no commercial or artificial herbicides, pesticides, insecticides or fertilizers have been used.
6. Small Garden exhibits will be grown by exhibitors with a total of less than 100 square feet of garden area.
7. Garden Displays
 - a. Only one variety of each fruit or vegetable is allowed.
 - b. Same fruit or vegetable quantity as in individual open classes.
 - c. Display container is the exhibitor’s choice.
 - d. Points will be awarded as follows: 1) Quality of fruits and vegetables 75% 2) Appearance and creativity of overall display 25%
 - e. Consists of 5 different fresh fruits or vegetable, in any combination of small (e.g.: green or yellow green beans, lima beans, peas), medium

(e.g.: cucumbers, tomatoes, carrots, bees, onions, peppers, potatoes, okra, sweet corn, herbs) or large (e.g.: watermelon, squash, pumpkin, eggplant, cabbage, cantaloupe)

8. Theme Displays consist of 5 different food items, 4 of which must be home grown fruits and /or vegetables and 1, which may be purchased, all of which combine to demonstrate a central theme. E.g.: Italian Theme – tomatoes, fresh oregano, fresh parsley, home grown garlic and purchased multi-colored pasta arranged in an attractive container of the exhibitor’s choice.
 - a. Displays will be limited to a four square foot table area, with no height limit.
 - b. Points will be awarded as follows: 1) Quality of fruits and Vegetables 50% 2) Appearance and creativity of the overall display 50%

1. Open to all beekeepers.
2. Exhibitor must produce all honey.
3. All jars must be plain and free of labels. No inner seals in lids.
4. Judging criteria will follow state fair guidelines.
5. Extracted Honey: Also known as strained honey is honey that has been separated from the comb by centrifugal force, gravity, staining or other means. Shall consist of 3 two-pound Queenline jars (glass or plastic).
6. Chunk Honey: Shall consist of 1 strip of cut comb (full length of jar) in three 1 lb. round glass jars.
7. Comb Honey: Three “rounds” “cassettes” (clear lids both sides, no pressure sensitive label), or “basswood sections” (cardboard carton with window, no producer’s name or address.
8. Cut Comb Honey: Three comb honeys cut and placed in commercial plastic comb honey boxes (4X4).
9. Crystallized /Creamed Honey: Shall consist of three glass jars between 8 oz. and 16 oz. all jars must be the same.
10. Gift Package: Items must be clearly labeled, as they would be offered for sale – except any marks identifying the entrant must be obscured or removed, or fictitious. Gift basket if wrapped, must be able to be unwrapped for judging.
11. Beeswax: 3 lb. block, geometric shape, not decorative, smooth surface top and bottom.

12. Beeswax Candles: four molded or dipped candles. No non-beeswax enhancement allowed, except wick.
13. Art Design in Beeswax: Entries must be 2 pounds minimum weight, 100% beeswax: may be more than one piece but must be firmly joined together: may be cast in mold or carved. No non-beeswax enhancement allowed.
14. Frame of Honey: Shallow or medium depth. Frame must be in a display case, both sides visible. Display case available upon request.
15. Youth entries ages 18 and under.

1. See General Rules.
2. The goals of the Quilting Department is to encourage beginning quilters, celebrate individual creativity, promote original design, and provide a venue to showcase current trends in quilting and vintage quilts.
3. A new category, “I Made It Myself!” has been created to encourage beginning quilters to show their first quilt and begin a tradition of entering their quilts in the fair. Quilts entered in this category may be of any size and technique.
4. A new category, “Fair Theme Challenge Wall Hanging” has been created to promote original design. Entries in this category are not to exceed 40” on any one side. Entries will be judged on creative interpretation of the 2009 theme, “Dancing With The Steers” Quilt may reflect the theme in any way the Exhibitor deems appropriate in color, pattern, fabric selection, design, and may include any quilting technique including surface embellishment.
5. Quilts may be quilted by hand or machine with the exception of Novelty Quilts that do not have quilting stitches.
6. All quilting must be the work of the exhibitor with the exception of classes which state “Quilted By Another” and Vintage Quilts. Quilted By Another classes acknowledge the current trend in which many quilters complete quilt tops and have them hand or machine quilted by someone else.
7. Vintage Quilts must be owned by the Exhibitor.
8. Quilted By Another and Vintage Quilts classes are not eligible for Champion or Reserve Champion, Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion ribbons.
9. All quilts must have been completed since the previous year’s fair, with the exception of Vintage Quilts.
10. Large quilts are defined as quilts intended for a bed, twin size or larger.
11. Crib/Baby/Lap quilts are defined as quilts smaller than twin size that are not wall hangings or table decorations.
12. Wall Hangings/Table Runners are intended to be used as a wall or surface decoration.
13. Miniature Quilts are defined as miniature representations of full size quilts not to exceed 24” x 24”. All surface techniques, quilting and finishing should be miniature in scale.

14. Art Quilts may be of any size and technique. Art Quilts are distinguished by the Innovative and/or Original Use of Fabric, Stitches, Design, or Embellishment.
15. 3-Dimensional Items may be of any size or technique and are defined as any item that does not lay flat. Examples are purses, bags, pillows, and dolls.
16. Any article entered in the wrong class will not be judged.
17. Exhibits limited to one entry per class.
18. Hanging sleeves are required for all wall hangings and are desirable for all entries to accommodate hanging for display as space allows.
19. Exhibitors are encouraged to include a photo of the full quilt with their entry, especially for large quilts so that the picture may be displayed with the quilt if space is limited for viewing the entire quilt after judging.
20. Names on entries must be covered until after judging is completed. Please conceal your name prior to turning it in for judging.
21. Entries must be clean and odor free. Any entry that is stained, soiled or has excessive pet hair will not be accepted.
22. Comment cards are available at check-in to share the history of an entry.
23. Care is taken to safe guard exhibits. Buildings are monitored when open and secured at closing.
24. Claim ticket(s), proper ID, and signature required for pick-up.
